The Empathy Project in partnership with Full Circle Theater Company at Park Square Theatre: *Sunday, 11/14 at 2pm and Wednesday 11/17 at 7:30pm.* This is a new play exploring empathy across geographic, political, and racial divides based on interviews of rural and urban Minnesotans—people like your neighbors, your friends, or even yourself. This play investigates the power and limits of empathy in a deeply fractured world. Directed by Claribel Gross and featuring a cast of nine: Song Kim, Dominique Jones, Shanan Custer, Oogie_Push, Siddeeqah Shabazz, Kim Vasquez, Peter Colburn, Marci Lucht, and Joshua C. Larson.

Christmas of Swing at the History Theatre: *Friday, 11/19 at 7:30pm.* Xmas Eve 1944. In this all-new reimagining of History Theatre's holiday classic, the Andrews Sisters open their mailbag, and letters from men and women serving overseas dance their way into the USO show and into our hearts. These powerful and enlightening stories from people of diverse backgrounds remind us of the importance of family, service, and of a nation united for the common good.

Shaamya – Of Equality in partnership with Katha Dance Theatre at Park Square Theatre: *Sunday, 11/21 at 2pm.* Inspired by the poetry of writer and activist **Kazi Nazrul Islam** (1899-1976), *Of Equality* uses dance, music, and spoken word to attempt to draw parallels between the experiences of today's communities of color and those expressed by Nazrul Islam back in the early 20th century. **Note: The performance will include ASL interpretation as well as a post-show discussion.**

All is Calm – The Christmas Truce of 1914 in partnership with Theater Latte Da at Ritz Theater: *Wednesday, 11/24 at 7:30pm and Wednesday, 12/15 at 7:30pm.* The Western Front, Christmas, 1914. Out of the violence comes a silence, then a song. A German soldier steps into No Man's Land singing "Stille Nacht." Thus begins an extraordinary night of camaraderie, music, peace. A remarkable true story, told in the words and songs of the men who lived it. The production features the talents of the Minneapolis-based cast who starred in the national broadcast and the highly lauded Off-Broadway run. **Note: performance on Nov 24 is a dress rehearsal.**

A Christmas Carol at Guthrie Theater: *Six performances between 11/19 and 12/2.* In this Charles Dickens' beloved classic, a miserly and miserable man, Ebenezer Scrooge greets each Christmas with "Bah! Humbug!" until he is visited one Christmas Eve by the Ghosts of Christmas Past, Christmas Present and Christmas Future. This world-premiere adaptation stays faithful to the text and invites audiences to experience the wonder of the holiday season through all-new scenery, costumes, props, lighting, and sound.
